

Bin 19 Chateau Puybarbe Bordeaux, France £16.95

Check out the fleshy, juicy fruit flavours and soft tannins – a big wine, with plenty of structure and class, but also a funky little number that slips down nicely.

Bin 20 Valduero Crianza Ribera del Duero, Spain £29.95

One of the most amazing wines on our list. From the ultra hip Ribera del Duero region to the west of Rioja, this powerhouse is all about fruit, fruit, fruit ... Gorgeous, lifted aromas of violets and Port and the faintest whiff of vanilla are served with the silkiest texture imaginable.

Sparkling

Borgo Magredo Prosecco, Italy £19.50

Prosecco is the sparkling wine for those who think they don't like sparkling wine! Racy, sparky, funky frolics, from your head down to your toes. Expect savoury lemon sherbet and pear drop fruit and ultra refreshment!

Champagne Duval-Leroy Brut NV, France £43.95

France's favourite Champagne – there are more famous names but very few can match the quality of this stunning fizz.

Whites

Dry River Chardonnay, Australia £3.50

Ripe floral aromas and crisp weighty mango fruit make this an instant crowd-pleaser.

Tierra del Rey Sauvignon Blanc, Chile £3.50

Classic Chilean Sauvignon Blanc, displaying all the ripe citrus and tropical fruits. One of the more creamy styles of Sauvignon Blanc. A real fruit explosion.

Reds

Dry River Shiraz, Australia £3.50

Rich and deep with loads of fruit, but refreshing as well – never gets syrupy or over the top.

Tierra del Rey Merlot, Chile £3.50

Everyone loves a good Merlot – soft and velvety with lovely smooth plum and damson fruit and no rough edges.

Bin 1 House White

Masia J Sauvignon Blanc, Spain £11.95
Wonderfully fresh and complex melon and citrus flavours tempered with a scent of honey on the finish.

Whites

Bin 2 Farnese Pinot Grigio, Italy £15.95
Oh happy days! It's got more soul than an Otis Redding duet with James Brown – a real fruit burst, a mouth coating texture, then a long, bone-dry finish. Awesome!

Bin 3 Santa Alicia Reserve Chardonnay, Chile £13.95
Harmonious in every way with integrated white pear and melon fruit backed up with buttered toast flavours from the French oak.

Bin 4 The Ned Pinot Grigio, New Zealand £17.95
Blisteringly brilliant Kiwi Sauvignon by Brent Marris, one of New Zealand's most passionate winemakers – Expect gorgeous, savoury notes of nectarine, pear drop and cream.

Bin 5 Crane Lake Chardonnay, California £13.95
Gorgeous cool fruit with aromas of melon, lime, hazelnuts and buttered toast. If you like a classy oaked chardonnay – this is for you!

Bin 6 Fairhall Cliffs Sauvignon Blanc, New Zealand £14.95
Will we ever tire of the brilliance of New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc? Well, as long as they keep producing lip-smacking tasty mango, passionfruit, nettle and asparagus beauties like this there's no chance.

House Red

Bin 7 Masia J Merlot, Spain £11.95
Brilliant wee glugger that ticks all the boxes! Dripping with bright damson fruit and a lovely silky mouthfeel, this is what Merlot is all about.

Reds

Bin 8 Santa Alicia Reserve Malbec, Chile £13.95
Dripping with dark, brambly Bourneville chocolate fruit, super tannins and a hint of vanilla from moderate use of American oak, this is a rare wine – delicate yet blockbusting, intimate yet extrovert. What a wine!

Bin 9 Heartland Stickleback Red, Australia £17.95
The wine world is full of visionaries and adventurers, but none of them have blazed a trail quite like Ben Glaetzer, the Qantas young winemaker of the Year. Here's a safe little blend of (amazingly good) Shiraz and Cabernet fruit, er ... with some Italian grape varieties chucked in for good measure! Utterly bewitching.

Bin 10 Farnese Montepulciano, Italy £15.95
We just love Montepulciano! Beautiful aromas of fig, chocolate and dark cherries explode on the palate. Enjoy!

Bin 11 Artiga Monastrell/ Tempranillo, Spain £14.95
Rich and dense with lovely use of oak, but never overpowering, this is just so good! Hints of cherry, chocolate, tobacco and vanilla and fine tannins will keep all lovers of Spanish wine seriously happy!

Bin 12 Crane Lake Pinot Noir, California £13.95
One of the best value Pinot Noirs you will ever taste. Phenomenal extractions complexity – glorious aromas of raspberry truffle are at the fore. You will adore this!

Rosé

Bin 13 V Rosé, Transylvania £13.95
This is a perfect example of the new wave of rosés bursting onto the international scene. If he likes red, but it's too heavy for you then go for this: you'll both love it, guaranteed!

Bin 14 Crane Lake White Zinfandel, California £13.95
If you like a bit of sweetness in your rosé then plump for this tasty little number from the USA. Expect hints of wild strawberries, raspberries and bubblegum! Yum!

Special Occasion Wines

Bin 15 Sancerre by J. P. Mollet, France £21.95
The world's best Sauvignon Blanc is still made in the Loire Valley as this beautiful wine illustrates. No bells and whistles, just pure lime fruit with a nice vegetal green herb touch. As with all of the very best French wines the key words are elegance and restraint.

Bin 16 Chablis, France £22.95
This is proper Chardonnay – no messing about with any crowd-pleasing tricks for the masses, just a glass of pure elegance aimed squarely at the Chablis lover who seeks ultra pure lime citrus and steel fruit, mouthwatering acidity and ultimate refreshment. A must with our lighter fish courses.

Bin 17 The King's Favour Sauvignon Blanc, New Zealand £24.95
An astounding New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc, you lot just can't get enough of this stuff. Absolutely buzzing with tropical fruit salad, cut grass and nettle aromas, this is like a bottled summer's day.

Bin 18 Langmeil Three Gardens, Australia £24.95
This fabulous Chateauneuf-du-Pape style blend is at the cutting edge of Australian winemaking, combining a feeling of European elegance and food friendliness with unabashed Aussie sunshine fruit.
